

About the Ministry Enrichment Gathering™

All liturgical ministers need a deep understanding of the Mass to help lead the parish community to recognize the Eucharist as the source of nourishment for their lives as Christians. The *Ministry Enrichment Gathering™* offers participants the opportunity to reflect on the power of the liturgy for themselves and those they serve.

In the celebration of the Eucharist, the faithful hear Christ himself speak in the proclamation of the Scriptures. In the *Ministry Enrichment Gathering™*, participants will examine the role of the Living Word in their own faith journeys and realize the necessity of “creating a culture of witness that testifies to the transformative power of the Gospel” in the life of the Church.

The Mass is not simply an event or an occasion in which a Catholic Christian visits the parish church; it is a celebration of their communal role in the missionary aspect of the Church. The *Ministry Enrichment Gathering™* will help participants identify “the activity of the Church” and then examine their role in it, both at liturgy and in the world.

From the liturgy, the faithful are sent to be, to enact, and to proclaim that presence in the world so that all may come to know Christ, to be welcomed into the Kingdom he proclaimed, and to participate in the praise and worship of God in the liturgy here on earth and in eternity. Through catechesis, storytelling, Church documents, art, music, and videos, participants renew their insight and energy for their ministries.

Welcoming the Presence of Christ

In the *Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy*, the Church proclaims that “Christ is always present in his Church, especially in its liturgical celebrations. He is present...in the person of his minister,...in the Eucharistic species,...in the sacraments,...in his word,...[and] when the church prays and sings” (7). In this session, we will consider how we might better recognize, welcome, and revere the presence of Christ in our liturgical celebrations. Reflecting on those moments where we might consciously think of Christ as more present than others, we will discuss ways to enhance participation and deepen the liturgical understanding of our parish communities through prayer, formation, and catechesis.
